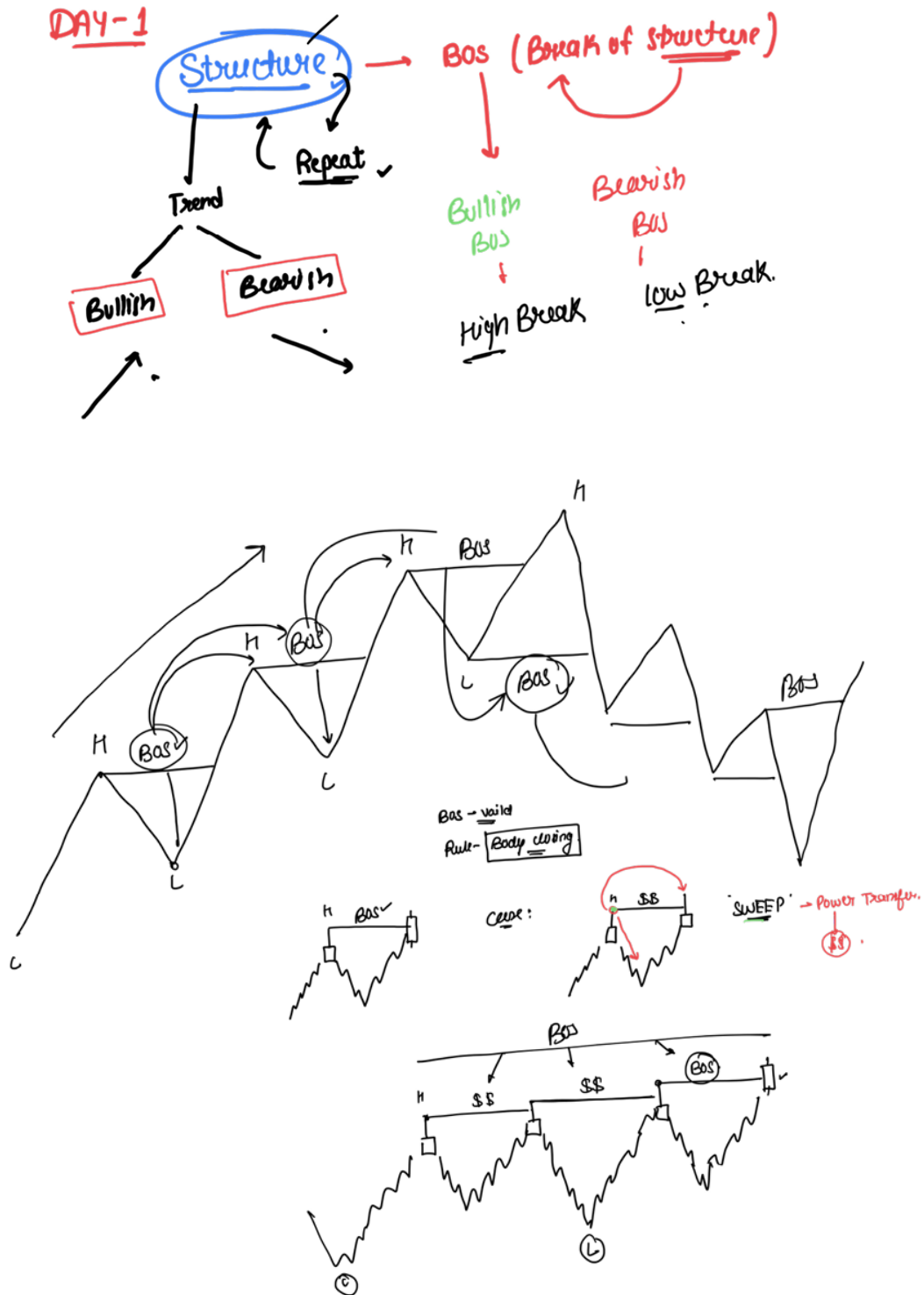


Market Structure

Price never moves in a straight line. It leaves a trail behind it — highs and lows, again and again. That trail is structure. Read it first, everything else comes after.



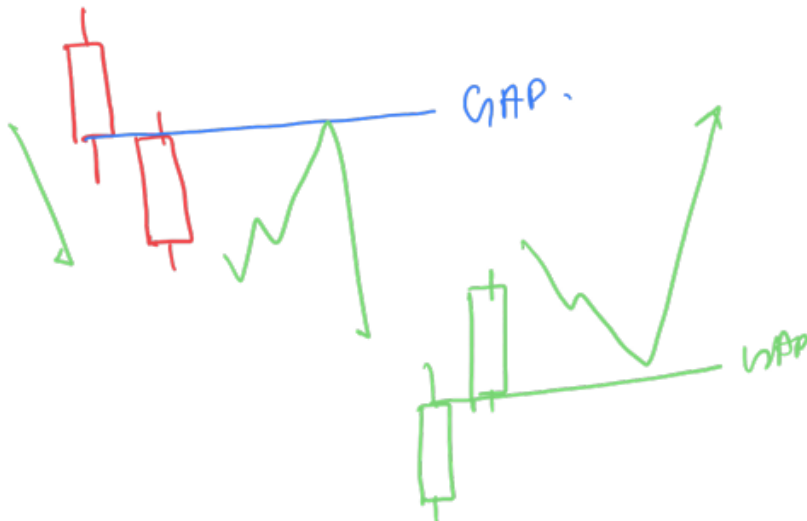
- BOS = Break of Structure.
- Rule — body closing.
- Sweep ≠ BOS.

Not every break is a valid one. A sweep takes the money and hands power to the other side — it is not the same thing as a break, and trading it like one is where the trend gets lost.

Clearance Level

Sometimes price does not walk. It runs. And when it runs, it leaves an empty pocket behind — a space between candles that nobody traded properly. That pocket is a Clearance Level.

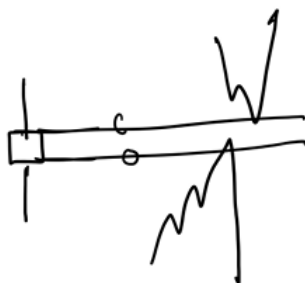
Price left this space behind in a hurry. Orders never got filled there - so it usually comes back before continuing.

A level is not just a line on the chart. What matters is what price does around it.

Which pocket is still worth something and which one is already finished — that filter is the part we work on live, chart by chart.

Doji Power

(HTF)

A doji is not confusion. On a higher timeframe it is one candle holding a whole fight inside it - both sides pushed, nobody won.

Where it shows up matters more than what it looks like.

When that close sits right on your level, the candle is telling you something. Learning to read which one to trust takes screen time, not a definition.

CRT – Candle Range Theory

One candle is not one candle. It is a range – a high, a low, and a middle. Once you start seeing it that way, a single higher timeframe candle tells you where price is trying to go.

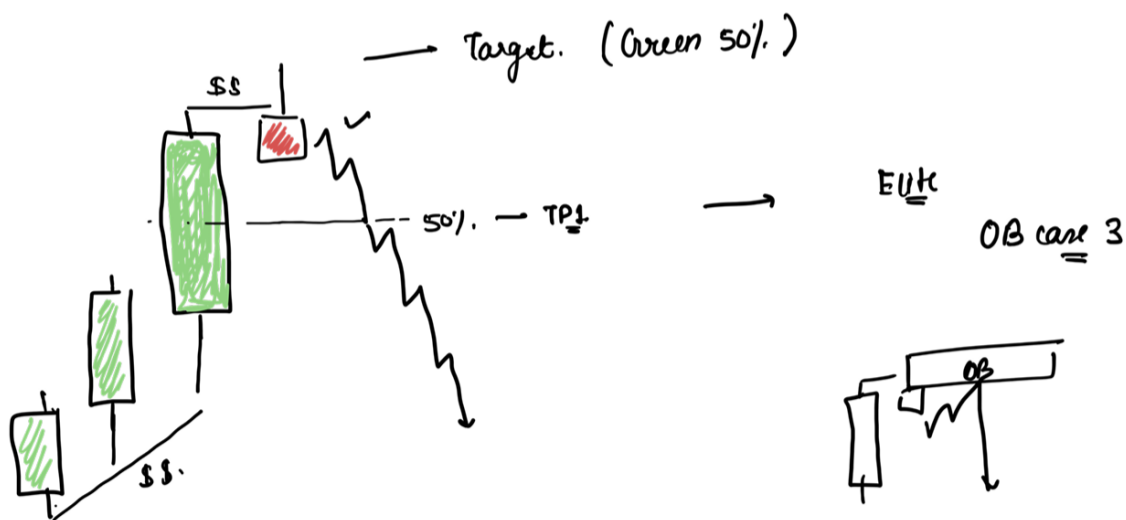
Direction → HTF → Candle Range → Entry → Target

Bias

Direction → HTF 1D, 1W, (4H).



Bias comes from the higher timeframe first – 1D, 1W, sometimes 4H. Never the other way round. The middle of the range, that 50% mark, is the first place price is drawn to.

Which candle you take the range from, and when that 50% stops being a target and becomes an entry instead – that is the execution side of it.
